A Look Into The Economy

These are good news for Lea County Residents! The months of April and May were great for the economy in the nation, but they were even more especial for the economy of Lea County. Oil prices have increased, and with it the unemployment rate has lowered in the county to a 5 year low! In the nation, small business owners are to see great opportunity for growth, and development, as according to a research done by Bank of America.

There are a lot of jobs open around the area in multiple fields. An article published at the News-Sun Newspaper says the unemployment rate for the month of April was a low 3.7 %, and "Not since April 2013 has the unemployment rate been 3.7 percent [which is] not the lowest ever, since the average for 2007 was 2.5 percent, but it's a lot better than June 2016 when the unemployment rate was 10 percent". This decrease in unemployment comes hand in hand with the statistic that 22% of small business owner's plan to hire more in the upcoming year (Bank of America).

Small business owners are feeling more confident about doing business with the hopes of keeping more of what they earn from the new tax reform. This confidence has allowed business owners to feel more optimistic about investing more. Some of the figures that show this confidence are, as according to the Bank of America research, 54% of surveyed people believing the national economy will improve, 60% planning to grow their business over the next 5 years, and 69% planning to expand their business in the year ahead!

If you are looking for a job, or thinking about starting a small business, it is probably a good time to go and pursue it as the economic outlook shows all the odds in favor for it.
